2. Approval of Minutes of the last meeting – 22nd March 2022

3. Matters Arising:

a. Tower Clock and Carillon

b. Bell fund Raising and Augmentation

Only in the event of a very successful fund raise exceeding our target, and in the event of the Town Council producing no funds, would the fund consider donating potential surplus funds to assist with the Tower Clock and Carillon costs.
- ii. It was agreed to promote wedding ringing and increase the wedding charge to £20 per rope and a £40 donation i.e., £200.

iii. It was agreed that at the annual subscription renewal, tower ringers could donate whatever they feel comfortable with to the Bell Fund, in addition to the £8 annual Guild and Branch subscriptions.

The major expenditure was £313.50 for additional muffles to enable fully muffled ringing for the Queen's funeral, and £190 for a peal board commemorating the 775th anniversary of the rededication of St Mary's in 2018.

Subscriptions include £88 paid into the account in the previous month which then needed to be paid to ODG.

It should also be noted that there was a donation of £100 to the new Bell Fund (Crispin Wills) which remains in the account. This effectively means the account stands at £774.84
